



DINOSAUR EXHIBIT COMES TO CEDAR FALLS!

University of Northern Iowa's University Museum is proud to host the viewing of Sue, a 42-foot long, 3000 pound Tyrannosaurus Rex replica. Sue roamed North America about 67 million years ago, one of the last dinosaur species and one of the largest flesh-eaters to have ever inhabited the Earth. This is one of 3 traveling exhibits from the Field Museum in Chicago. As the largest, most complete T. rex specimen ever discovered, Sue has tremendous value for scientists and the general public. Only a handful of T. rex specimens have been found that are about 60% complete. At 90% complete and exquisitely preserved, SUE is the most celebrated member of its species, permitting more detailed studies of the biology, growth, and behavior of T. rex than have previously been possible.
