



**COME AND SEE THE MOST COMPLETE AND BEST PRESERVED SKELETON OF A TYRANNOSAURUS REX TO DATE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN IOWA MUSEUM

SUE WAS A TYRANNOSAURUS REX WHO ROAMED NORTH AMERICA ABOUT 67 MILLION YEARS AGO, ONE OF THE LAST DINOSAUR SPECIES AND ONE OF THE LARGEST FLESH-EATERS TO HAVE EVER INHABITED THE EARTH. THE "TYRANT LIZARD KING," WITH ITS EXTRAORDINARILY POWERFUL JAWS AND MASSIVE SERRATED STEAK-KNIFE TEETH, STILL DOMINATES POPULAR PERCEPTIONS OF THE AGE OF DINOSAURS.

ONLY A HANDFUL OF *T. REX* SPECIMENS HAVE BEEN FOUND THAT ARE ABOUT 60% COMPLETE. AT 90% COMPLETE AND EXQUISITELY PRESERVED, *SUE* IS THE MOST CELEBRATED MEMBER OF ITS SPECIES, PERMITTING MORE DETAILED STUDIES OF THE BIOLOGY, GROWTH, AND BEHAVIOR OF *T. REX* THAN HAVE PREVIOUSLY BEEN POSSIBLE.
